

Proportion of people aged 25-34 with a tertiary qualification


The proportion of tertiary-qualified young women exceeded the proportion for young men in 2005 and has continued to increase

Proportion of people aged 20-24 in employment


The gap between employment rates for young women and men has narrowed but the rate for young men remains higher

Median annual real income from all sources for people in their 20s


Incomes for young men remain substantially higher than for young women but the gap has narrowed for those aged 25-29

Proportion of people aged 20-24 who are not in employment, education or training (NEET rate)

The NEET rate for young women fell substantially after 2010 but remains higher than the rate for young men
